## **Registration**

International delegates should follow the same process of registration as all other delegates. Details are on our website. All fees are payable in advance. We cannot confirm your place at the conference without payment of registration fee.

Once completed registration forms as well as payment are received, we will send you a confirmation letter. The letter will also request certain personal information to include in an invitation which will be sent to you for visa purposes.

Please note that we are not responsible for securing visas for delegates from abroad.

## **Payment of Registration Fees**

International delegates can pay their registration fees online at our website. They can also pay by bank transfer. Please email us for further details if you wish to pay by bank transfer.

## **Hotel and accommodation**

We have negotiated reduced rates at hotels close to the venue of the conference. A list of these hotels is on our website. Most UK hotels require payment in advance or your credit card details.

## **Cancellations and Refunds**

Cancellations must be received in writing at least two weeks before the conference. No refunds will be made for cancellations received after 14 days to the conference. We will refund 90% of fees paid in cases where visas are not secured to enable attendance at this event. We will retain 10% of fees paid to cover our administration costs.
